# Background

- Hospital pharmacists play an important role in improving patient outcomes and safety
- Many hospitalized patients and their families are unaware of the presence and role of the pharmacist
- Canadian Society of Hospital Pharmacists (CSHP) 2015 objective: "50% of recently hospitalized patients or their caregivers will recall speaking with a pharmacist while in the hospital"

## **Objectives:**

- Increase families' awareness of the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) pharmacist
- Describe topics families want to discuss with the NICU pharmacist

## **Primary Outcome:**

 The percentage of families who recall speaking with a NICU pharmacist prior to and during an intervention

#### Methods

Study Design: Prospective study, convenience sample Surveys:

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- Families surveyed at time of discharge: 4 weeks pre-intervention and 6 weeks during intervention
- Pharmacists surveyed: pre and post intervention period

Intervention: Pharmacist introduced self to families and provided verbal and written information (pamphlet)

- Role of the pharmacist
- Types of questions to ask the pharmacist

#### **Inclusion Criteria:**

Parents and/or primary caregivers of babies in the NICU

# **Exclusion Criteria:**

- Families unable to speak, read or write English
- Families of deceased patients

#### **Statistical Analysis:**

- Family data: Fisher's Exact Test (2-sided)
- Pharmacist data: Descriptive Statistics

Figure 1. Family Recall of Pharmacist Introduction and Interaction





Figure 2. Topics Families Would Like to Discuss with a Pharmacist




# Table 1. Pharmacist Recall of Introduction and Interaction with Families

| N = 6        | Pre-Intervention<br>(Median % Families)<br>(range) | Post-Intervention<br>(Median % Families)<br>(range) |
|--------------|--|---|
| Introduction | 4 (0-15)   | 4 (1-25)  |
| Interaction  | 5 (0-20)   | 4 (0-40)  |

- 143 babies in NICU during intervention period
- 35 pamphlets handed out to families by NICU pharmacists

### Limitations

- Small sample size
- Short intervention period
- Participation in intervention not optimal: internal and external factors

#### Conclusions

- The percentage of families who recall speaking with a NICU pharmacist prior to and during the intervention was similar
- 86% of surveyed families in the NICU indicated they would like to speak with a pharmacist
- Families identified several medication related topics of interest
- Future initiatives needed to assist pharmacists to achieve CSHP 2015 objective
